We've said it before and we'll say it again, we wouldn't be where we are today without our amazing faculty. Our instructors are highly respected in their careers and bring years of experience to the table.

One of our nearest and dearest, BMSim examiner $\underline{\text{TOD TRUELOVE}}$ has been with GSBLSU for 11 years. About a month ago, Tod retired



from his position with the Tennessee Department of Financial Institution after 33 years. The following press

release went out on April 23rd announcing Tod's retirement. We're so happy for you Tod, but we're not *not* jealous. (Just so you know this doesn't mean you're allowed to retire from us too).

Tod Trulove is retiring at the end of April after 33 years of service to the Department. He has served the last 20 years as Assistant Commissioner of the Bank Division. Trulove began his career as an examiner in the middle Tennessee region and was promoted multiple times to ultimately lead this division, which supervises state-chartered banks, trust companies, and business and industrial development corporations (BIDCOs). Tod's career with the Department was characterized by the close working relationships he cultivated with the industry and fellow state and federal regulators. Since 2013, he served as an instructor at the Graduate School of Banking at Louisiana State University, of which he was also an alumnus. Tod is a native of Columbia, Tennessee, and a graduate of Middle Tennessee State University.

"Tod has done much to ensure a safe and sound Tennessee banking system," said Commissioner Gonzales. "Tennessee is indeed grateful for his service, and we wish him well in this next chapter."

MIKE THE TIGER



If you haven't made the trek across campus to pay Mike the Tiger a visit yet, you should definitely do so before heading home. LSU has housed a live tiger on campus since Mike I arrived in 1936. In true cat fashion, Mike loves a good nap. Odds are he'll be snoozing whenever you

stop by, but you may get lucky and see him go for a swim in his stream.

Mike I arrived from the Little Rock Zoo and reigned for nearly 20 years at LSU. Legend has it that Mike II died shortly after arriving on campus and was replaced by a second tiger, although all rumors were repeatedly denied. The "second" Mike II reigned at LSU for only one season.

Mike III was born in 1957 and served as mascot for 18 years. He was reportedly the only tiger who would growl on cue. Mike IV arrived on campus in 1976 and reigned for 14 years on campus. In 1981, someone cut the chain to his enclosure, releasing him to roam about campus.



LSU police called the vet staff at 1AM to tell them that Mike

was in the middle of North Stadium Drive. He wandered into the Bernie Moore Track Stadium where vet staff were able to tranquilize and return him safely to his enclosure.

Mike V arrived on campus in 1989 and served as mascot for 17 years. Of all the tigers that served as mascot, he was described as the easiest to handle with a "calm and friendly" disposition. Mike VI was born in 2005 and arrived on campus in 2007 when he was 2 years old. He served as mascot for 9 years until he was diagnosed with cancer in 2016. He underwent radiotherapy at Mary Bird Perkins Cancer Center in Baton Rouge, but a later CT scan revealed that his tumor had grown, and the cancer spread despite treatment.

The current mascot, Mike VII was born on September 13, 2016. Prior to taking on the role of Mike the Tiger, he was named "Harvey" and was donated to the school in August of 2017 from a sanctuary in Okeechobee, FL called "Wild at Heart Wildlife Center." Currently, Mike VII lives in a \$3.7 million, 15,000 square foot environment tucked between Tiger Stadium and the PMAC.

Mikes IV-VII were all rescue tigers donated to the school by various sanctuaries. Mike has a full vet staff and USDA licensed care plan to ensure he receives the best possible care. He's arguably the most famous (and loved) tiger in the world! (stats via mikethetiger.com sponsored by TAF)
