memories, and we wish you the greatest success in your careers!



THE FINAL POOP



June 1, 1973

"As the banker walks" is about as close as one can get to "as the crow flies". Between the Conpound and Lockett Hall, the knowledgeable banker has learned to cut across lawns, parking lots, through shrubs, in between trees, and diagonally across streets without regard for yellow lines.
