LSU MEMORIAL TOWER

One of LSU's most iconic landmarks, the Memorial Bell Tower rises 175 feet above campus — but its significance runs much deeper. Built in 1923 and dedicated in 1926, it honors the 1,447 Louisianans who lost their lives in World War I. Their names are etched inside the rotunda, a lasting reminder of sacrifice and service.

As one of the first buildings on LSU's present campus, the tower also houses a military museum open Monday–Friday from 10 AM to 3 PM. Inside, you'll find artifacts from both World Wars — from cadet uniforms and student handbooks to handwritten wartime notebooks and stories of LSU alumni who served bravely, including the legendary WWII plane "Mike – the Spirit of LSU."

Outside, the plaza and surrounding grounds continue that legacy of tradition and remembrance. The Westminster chimes ring every quarter hour, the alma mater plays at noon, and just beyond, the Memorial Oak Grove stands in honor of alumni who gave their lives in service.

Take a moment to pause at the tower. Reflect. Remember. And if time allows, step inside — it's a small visit with great meaning.
